Nevada's "Safe Haven" law protects babies from being injured or otherwise harmed due to unsafe and illegal abandonment by providing distressed parents a safe, anonymous option for surrender of a newborn baby less than 30 days old who has not been abused.

Illegal abandonment puts the baby's life at risk, and as a result, the parents are legally punished. Safe Haven's goal is to prevent the baby from being harmed and for parents to have a safe and legal option to surrender their child if they cannot care for him or her.

Locations to safely surrender your baby include:

- Your local Hospital
- An Urgent Care Facility
- An occupied Police or Fire Station or
- By dialing 911
